SAMPLE ITINERARY

DAY 1: Arrive Vancouver

Arrive Vancouver. Please catch a taxi to your Vancouver hotel. The remainder of the day is free for you to rest, relax and discover Vancouver at leisure. Blessed with a spectacular Pacific Rim location, Vancouver is a study in contrasts and cohesion. Set between the mountains and the sea, the city blends cultures and landscapes, allowing visitors to enjoy a modern, cosmopolitan city alongside the great outdoors.

Hotel: Landmark Empire Hotel or similar

Day 2: (Vancouver to Jasper – Canada Rockies Coach Tour)

Depart from Vancouver and drive through the farming communities of the Fraser Valley. Ascend into the Coastal Mountains and follow the Coquihalla Highway to Kamloops, in the arid interior of British Columbia. After lunch, retrace the route of the famous Overlanders along the North Thompson River to reach your hotel in Jasper. Overnight in Jasper at Lobstick Lodge. (B)



Day 3: (Jasper to Banff)

Your day starts with a scenic hike through Maligne Canyon before heading south. Then, travel along the world-famous Icefields Parkway to take in some of nature's most spectacular mountain scenery. Have your camera ready for possible wildlife sightings! Highlights include Athabasca Falls, Peyto Lake, and the Columbia Icefield. Ride the "Ice Explorer"* on Athabasca Glacier or visit the Glacier Skywalk*. Overnight in Banff at Banff Inns. (B)

Day 4: (Sightseeing in Banff National Park)

Enjoy a full day of sightseeing in Banff National Park. Start your morning with a leisurely hike in Johnston Canyon and stroll along the shores of picturesque Lake Louise and Moraine Lake. In the afternoon, visit the world famous Banff Springs Hotel and Bow Falls. With your free time in Banff, you may also choose from optional activities such as soaking in the natural spa at the Upper Hot Springs* or taking a gondola ride to the top of Sulphur Mountain*. Overnight in Lake Louise. Overnight Lake Louise Inn. (B)

Day 5: Banff to Vancouver

This morning, enjoy a drive through Rogers Pass, the highest part of the route to the Rockies. On your scenic return journey through Yoho National Park, catch a glimpse of an engineering marvel: the Spiral Tunnels. Arrive in downtown Vancouver. Make your own way to your overnight hotel for 1 night.



Day 6: Alaska Inside Passage Cruise departs from Seattle

Transfer by motor coach from your Vancouver hotel to the Seattle Cruise terminal to check in for your Alaska Inside Passage Cruise on ***Emerald Princess***.

Seattle: The bustling Washington port known as the "The Emerald City" is both a culturally rich metropolis and a gateway to beautiful natural attractions. In the shadows of the widely recognized Space Needle, the Seattle Centre is home to the city's sports arena and many museums and theatres. The lively Pike Place Market and the mammoth "Hammering Man" sculpture are downtown must-sees. Visitors also flock to the waterfront for fresh seafood, the Harbor Steps Park or to board a ferry bound for Puget Sound.

Ketchikan: A traveller's first view of this Inside Passage port town may be of a boat-filled harbor enveloped in snow-capped mountains. The rustic city of Ketchikan has been called the totem pole capital of the world. Tours show off the city's streets, restored from the pioneer days; the harbor's salmon canneries; and the world's oldest collection of totem poles at the Totem Heritage Centre. Sport fishing, kayaking, hiking, bear watching and Misty Fjords seaplane excursions are also popular.

Secluded in the Tongass National Forest, **Tracy Arm** boasts some of the most spectacular views in North America. At the head of the fjord, you will observe dramatic views of the twin Sawyer Glaciers, which are surrounded by towering mountains that rise over 7,000 feet over the blue water. You will also see waterfalls and tidewater glaciers along the way and you may even catch a glimpse of the wildlife that calls this area home: the great bald eagle, seals relaxing on the icebergs and if you are lucky, a bear or mountain goat

Juneau: Alaska's capital city of Juneau is a dramatic sight with a backdrop of lush green mountains. Visitors here can drive, float, paddle or take a helicopter to the monumental Mendenhall Glacier. Other popular excursions include cruising along the straits and sounds of the Tongass National Forest, prospecting for gold at the original site of gold discovery or visiting the Alaska State Museum and the Alaska Brewing Company.

Skagway: As the northernmost point of the Inside Passage, the town reflects its mining past in the false-front buildings and gold rush relics. Tourists can experience the majesty of White Pass summit and the Yukon Territory aboard the railway, paddle to Glacier Bay and Chilkoot Bald Eagle Preserve, get a close-up view of the natural beauty on a wilderness safari, soar over glaciers on a helicopter tour or, for those who catch the fever, pan for gold.

Victoria: Victoria revels in its English essence at the southernmost tip of Vancouver Island. Afternoon teas, double-decker buses and English inns, gardens and pubs are common in this capital city. The most popular attraction is the world-famous Butchart Gardens, flaunting 50 acres of floral magnificence. Other must-sees include the historic Empress Hotel, the Scottish-style Craigdarroch Castle and the Royal British Columbia Museum, where tourists will find a reconstruction of a turn-of-the-century street.

Why I Love Fiji

What makes Fiji exceptional isn't any must-see sights or unforgettable experiences (though those are pretty thick on the ground): for me, it's her people. Whether I'm visiting a village, dodging coconuts on the beach or walking through the big cities, nary a

moment goes by without being dazzled by genuine smiles, bombarded by BULA!s or having a shower of smooches land on my baby daughter. I get goose bumps recalling traditional, eerily-beautiful songs of welcome and farewell: even though we're just passing through, I always come away feeling like a member of a big family. Fijians greet guests with a rousing 'Welcome home!'... And they mean it.

Wetter is Better

Fiji's calm seas belie the riot of life going on beneath them. With seemingly endless reels of intensely coloured reefs, over 1500 species of fish and colossal creatures – from otherworldly manta rays to tiger sharks – Fiji's underwater world is worth the plunge. Seasoned divers and snorkellers will find plenty to excite them, while first-timers – looked after by top-notch dive masters and experienced guides – will be bubbling excited exclamations into their mouthpieces. Anywhere a fin flashes or coral may wave, you'll find a diving or snorkel daytrip, though there are excellent live-aboard journeys for those after a truly immersive experience.

Beyond the Beach

While it's easy to spend your holiday in, on or under the water, those who take the time to towel off will be rewarded by a wealth of terra firma treats. Fiji offers ample opportunities for hikers, birdwatchers, amblers and forest-fanciers, particularly on the islands of Taveuni – known as 'The Garden Island' for its ludicrously lush interiors – and Kadavu, a less-travelled slice of prehistoric paradise with almost no roads to speak of. If urban wildlife is your thing, Suva boasts a surprising nightlife scene, while towns like Savu Savu entice with rollicking taverns and meet-the-locals haunts.

A Warm Welcome

Fijian life revolves around the church, the village, the rugby field and the garden. While this may sound insular, you'd be hard-pressed to find a more open and welcoming populace. Though the realities of local life are less sunny than the country's skies – many regions are poor and lack basic services – Fijians are famous for their hospitality, and exude a warmth that money can't buy. Such bonhomie means it's easy to make friends with resort staff or on tours, but the best way to get to know the culture is on a homestay at an indigenous village.

Throwing Down the (Beach) Towel

Dazzling sands, perfect palm trees and waters so blue they glow: if you don't see them with your own eyes, you'll swear Fiji's beaches have been airbrushed. While stunning stretches abound, it's on the islands of the Mamanucas and Yasawas that you'll find Fiji's most heavenly heavyweights. These beaches are a posterchild for Paradise, luring thousands of visitors keen to discover their own South Sea idyll. The appeal of the islands stretches beyond holiday happy snaps; their reefs, bays and sublime sands have provided cinematic eye-candy to films including Tom Hanks' Cast Away and 1980 teen-dream classic The Blue Lagoon.
