PROPOSED DAILY ITINERARY

Day 1 -Saturday: Arrive New York City

Arrive in New York City, the most populous city in the United States and the largest city since 1790. Catch a taxi or an Airport Shuttle to your hotel located near Central Park and Times Square. New York City comprises 5 boroughs sitting where the Hudson River meets the Atlantic Ocean. At its core is Manhattan, a densely populated borough that's among the world's major commercial, financial and cultural centers. Its iconic sites include skyscrapers such as the Empire State Building and sprawling Central Park. Broadway theater is staged in neon-lit Times Square.

(Advise your Consultant if you'd prefer to arrange an arrival Transfer)

Standard Hotel: Washington Jefferson Hotel or similar for 2 nights.

Day 2 - Sunday: New York City Tour

You will enjoy a day tour of New York City. The "Best of" Manhattan Experience is a shortened version of our Manhattan Experience tour, designed for a full day of NYC touring, but won't overlap with evening plans. This 6-hour tour will take you through the island of Manhattan from top to bottom, as your guide provides interesting narration along the way and walks you through each exploration stop. The "Best of" Manhattan Experience includes an authentic lunch in Little

Italy at one of the neighbourhoods' oldest restaurants, Grotta Azzura and views of the city from a new perspective on a Manhattan harbor tour. End the day back in Times Square with just enough time to get ready for a night on the town.



Day 3 - Monday: New York-Finger Lakes-Niagara Falls

Please make your way to the meeting point for your early departure this morning. Heading north where we will pass the beautiful Delaware Gap to Watkins Glen State Park in the heart of the Finger Lakes region. Walk through Watkins Glen Canyon to visit the beautiful waterfalls and then continue to Niagara Falls passing Seneca Lake, arriving in the late afternoon. Tour the American Side of the Falls including the American Falls, Goat Island and sister Island At night tour Niagara Falls where we can appreciate the colourful lighting of the waters. Niagara Falls, Ontario, is a Canadian city at the famous waterfalls of the same name, linked with the U.S. by the Rainbow Bridge. Its site on the Niagara River's western shore overlooks the Horseshoe Falls, the cascades' most expansive section. Elevators take visitors to a lower, wetter vantage point behind the falls. A cliffside park features a promenade alongside 520-ft.-high Skylon Tower with an observation deck.

Day 4 - Tuesday: Niagara Falls-New Jersey

Leaving the hotel, hear the thundering water of Niagara-falls. See the falls up close from the Horse shoe falls and, experience the power aboard the Maid of the Mist (May- October). All other months we tour the Scenic Tunnels on a Journey behind the falls. At Noon we depart south to New-York State. On the way to New York, enjoy a shopping excursion at one of the large outlet malls

along the way find your own bargain with brand name stores for less. In the evening arrive to our hotel in New Jersey.

Day 5- Wednesday: New Jersey-Philadelphia-Washington DC

Depart New Jersey and Pennsylvania to the city of brotherly love Philadelphia. Upon arrival we embark on a panoramic tour that includes, Benjamin Franklin Parkway, Elbert Alley (The oldest inhabited street in America) and more. Arriving in the Historic area of Philadelphia we visit the famous Liberty Bell, and Constitution square and Constitution Hall, one of the symbols of freedom in America. Departing Philadelphia we see the famous "Rocky Steps" and then continue south passing through the states of Delaware and Maryland before arriving directly on Capitol Hill. See the Capitol, Senate and White House to understand the core of the US government. Continue to the Air and Space Museum before visiting the Lincoln, Washington, Korea and Vietnam Memorials.

Washington, DC, the U.S. capital, is a compact city on the Potomac River, bordering the states of Maryland and Virginia. It's defined by imposing neoclassical monuments and buildings – including the iconic ones that house the federal government's 3 branches: the Capitol, White House and Supreme Court. It's also home to iconic museums and performing-arts venues such as the Kennedy Center.



Day 6 - Thursday Washington DC-Amish Country-New York

Start the day with a visit to Arlington National Cemetery the changing of the guards and the Kennedy family gravesite. Next, visit the Mint and learn how the US tries to keep the US Dollar safe from counterfeiters. We then head north to Lancaster County home of the Amish Community. We start our visit with a ride on an authentic Amish Buggy through the Amish farm country and learn how they live without the benefit of modern technology, no electricity, running water, telephone service, or appliances. After the ride we visit the Amish marketplace where we can shop for handmade arts crafts and products. In the late afternoon

we depart east for an evening arrival in New York and own arrangements.
Overnight New York

Day 7 - Friday: New York to Vancouver

Fly from New York to Western Canada. Arrive Vancouver. Please catch a taxi to your Vancouver Hotel. The remainder of the day is free for you to rest, relax and discover Vancouver at leisure. Hotel: Buchan Hotel or similar



CANADIAN ROCKIES COACH TOUR

VANCOUVER, JASPER, LAKE LOUISE, BANFF, VANCOUVER

Day 8 - Saturday: Board Canada Rockies Tour.

Today you will join Canada Rockies Coach tour as wind its way through the farming communities of the Fraser Valley and Coast Mountains to the interior of British Columbia. From Kamloops, follow the Thompson River to the Albreda Glaciers. While Italy has Venice and Florence, Canada has Banff and Jasper, legendary natural marvels that are as spectacular and vital as anything the ancient Romans ever built. But don't think these protected areas have no history. Of the thousands of national parks scattered around the world today, Banff, created in 1885, is the third oldest, while adjacent Jasper was only 22 years behind. Situated on the eastern side of the Canadian Rockies, the two bordering parks were designated Unesco World Heritage sites in 1984, along with BC's Yoho and Kootenay, for their exceptional natural beauty coupled with their manifestation of important glacial and alluvial geological processes. In contrast to some of North America's wilder parks, they both support small towns that lure between 2 to 5 million visitors each year. Despite all this, the precious balance between humans and nature continues to be delicately maintained. Overnight in Jasper at Lobstick Lodge.

Day 9 - Sunday: Jasper to Banff

En-route to the historic Jasper town site, visit Mount Robson, the highest peak of the Rockies. Easily accessed by train or bus, and by car in summer, Jasper is surrounded by the jagged peaks of Jasper National Park. Home to an amazing abundance of wildlife, the area is an adventure sports lover's playground. The magnificent Columbia Icefield is to the south of the small town. Summer visitors hike, climb, golf and explore. In winter, skiing, snowboarding and dog sledding

top the bill. If it's chilly, heat up at Miette Hot Springs in the National Park. Restaurants and bars hop year-round. Enjoy a leisurely hike through Maligne Canyon before heading south along the world-famous Icefields Parkway to take in some of nature's most spectacular mountain scenery. Have your camera ready for possible wildlife sightings! Highlights include Athabasca Falls, Peyto Lake, and the Columbia Icefield. Ride the "Ice Explorer"* on the Athabasca Glacier. Overnight in Banff at Banff Inns.



Day 10 - Monday: Sightseeing in Banff National Park

Enjoy a full day of sightseeing in Banff National Park. Start your morning with a leisurely hike in Johnston Canyon and stroll along the shores of picturesque Lake Louise and Moraine Lake. Alpine, cross-country skiing, heli-skiing and snowboarding are popular activities in quiet Lake Louise, 35 miles east of Banff, as are ice fishing, skating, dog sledding and ice climbing. In summer, the area attracts almost as many visitors to its trails, waters and rock faces. Peer into turquoise Lake Louise in Banff National Park, three miles from the town of the same name, and be amazed by the colour. The renowned grand hotel Chateau Lake Louise sits at the brim of the eponymous lake. In the afternoon, visit the world famous Banff Springs Hotel and Bow Falls. With your free time in Banff, you may also choose from optional activities such as soaking in the natural spa at the Upper Hot Springs* or taking a gondola ride to the top of Sulphur Mountain*. Overnight in Lake Louise at Lake Louise Inn.

Day 11- Tuesday: Banff to Vancouver

This morning, enjoy a drive through Rogers Pass, the highest part of the route to the Rockies. On your scenic return journey through Yoho National Park, catch a glimpse of an engineering marvel: the Spiral Tunnels. Arrive in downtown Vancouver in the evening. Overnight Landmark Empire Hotel Vancouver or similar for 4 nights.



Day 12 & 13 - Wednesday & Thursday: Free days Vancouver. The next two days you are set to explore the City by the Bay with your two day hop on hop off Vancouver Trolley ticket. You are free to explore Vancouver at leisure. Visit Granville Island and Stanley Park. There is so much to do in Vancouver. Vancouver, a bustling west coast seaport in British Columbia, is among Canada's densest, most ethnically diverse cities. A popular filming location, it's surrounded by mountains, and also has thriving art, theatre and music scenes. Vancouver Art Gallery is known for its works by regional artists, while the Museum of Anthropology houses preeminent First Nations collections.

Day 14 - Friday: Whistler Day Tour. Home to the 2010 Olympic Winter Games, Whistler is an award winning, internationally renowned, year-round resort nestled in the Central Mountain range. The journey up the Sea to Sky Highway is just like it sounds—a winding spectacle of ocean and mountain scenery including the roaring Shannon Falls and cultural Squamish Adventure Centre. As the majestic backdrop of Whistler and Blackcomb Mountain unveils before your eyes, the adventure at our Whistler Village destination is yours to create. Whistler is a town north of Vancouver, British Columbia, that's home to Whistler Blackcomb, one of the largest ski resorts in North America. Besides skiing and snowboarding, the area offers snowshoeing, tobogganing and ski jumping at the Olympic Park, a venue for the 2010 Vancouver Winter Olympics. The hub of Whistler is a compact, chalet-style pedestrian village at the base of Whistler and Blackcomb mountains.

Day 15 - Saturday: Vancouver to Seattle. Transfer by motor coach from Vancouver to Seattle. Spend the rest of the day exploring Seattle at leisure. Overnight at the Inn on Virginia Mason or similar. Seattle, a city on Puget Sound in the Pacific Northwest, is surrounded by water, mountains and evergreen forests, and contains thousands of acres of parkland. Washington State's largest city, it's home to a large tech industry, with Microsoft and Amazon headquartered in its metropolitan area. The futuristic Space Needle, a 1962 World's Fair legacy, is its most iconic landmark.

Day 16 - Sunday: Alaska Inside Passage Cruise from Seattle. Transfer by taxi to Seattle cruise port to check in for you Alaska Inside Passage Glacier Cruise on Emerald Princess Ship.

Day 23 - Sunday Seattle to Los Angeles.

Please make your own way to Seattle SEA-TAC Airport for your flight to Los Angeles. Overnight Crowne Plaza Los Angeles Airport. Los Angeles is a sprawling Southern California city and the center of the nation's film and television industry. Near its iconic Hollywood sign, studios such as Paramount Pictures, Universal and Warner Brothers offer behind-the-scenes tours. On Hollywood Boulevard, TCL Chinese Theatre displays celebrities' hand- and footprints, the Walk of Fame honors thousands of luminaries and vendors sell maps to stars' homes.

Day 24 - Monday Los Angeles-Santa Barbara-Carmel-San Francisco

Please make your way to the meeting point for your early departure this morning. Heading north up the spectacular California Coast to the first stop in Santa Barbara. Visit a Spanish Mission and learn how these religious outposts were key in the development of the entire region. Continue to Solvang, a quaint Danish community to browse in the local shops. Continue to charming Carmel, home to actor Clint Eastwood. Stroll through town before heading on to Silicon Valley for overnight. San Francisco, in northern California, is a hilly city on the tip of a peninsula surrounded by the Pacific Ocean and San Francisco Bay. It's known for its year-round fog, iconic Golden Gate Bridge, cable cars and colourful Victorian houses. The Financial District's Transamerica Pyramid is its most distinctive skyscraper. In the bay sits Alcatraz Island, site of the notorious former prison.

Day 25 - Tuesday San Francisco-Bay Cruise-Golden Gate Bridge-Chinatown

Today we understand why San Francisco is one of the most beautiful cities in the world. We start our tour at the Fisherman's Wharf with a cruise in the world famous bay, under the Golden Gate Bridge and around the notorious Alcatraz Island. Return to Pier 39 for a leisurely lunch before an afternoon tour that takes in all the city's famous landmarks, including the Golden Gate Bridge, Union square, Chinatown and Nob Hill. Our tour ends with a night view of the city from the Bay Bridge.

Day 26 - Wednesday San Francisco-Yosemite

Today's route goes through farmlands of the Joaquin Valley to Yosemite National Park. This 1,200 square mile wonderland of forests, lakes and waterfalls is located in the Sierra Nevada. Stop at El Capitan, Bridal-Veil Falls, Half Dome and Mariposa Grove home to the world's largest living things the Sequoia Trees. In the evening, drive south towards Las Vegas. In the winter depart south to route no 1, for a visit to the world famous Hearst Castle. Built by the newspaper baron William Randolph Hearst, tour the famous house filled with antiques and see why the castle served as a playground for the rich and famous for the first half of the 20th century. Yosemite National Park is in California's Sierra Nevada mountains. It's famed for its giant, ancient sequoia trees, and for Tunnel View, the iconic vista of towering Bridalveil Fall and the granite cliffs of El Capitan and Half Dome. In Yosemite Village are shops, restaurants, lodging, the Yosemite Museum and the Ansel Adams Gallery, with prints of the photographer's renowned black-and-white landscapes of the area.

Day 27 - Thursday Yosemite-Bakersfield-Las Vegas

Today's route is east through the desert and Death Valley to arrive at the gambling capital of the world: Las Vegas We stop for lunch at the outlet mall in Barstow, which is filled with all the famous brand names like, Levi's, Nike, Reebok, Timberland and more. In the evening we take a tour of the strip to see some of the truly amazing hotels and fantasies that are built in the middle of the desert, such as Caesar's Palace, Mirage, Luxor, Paris, Mandalay Bay, New York New York, Treasure Island and more. Finish off the evening at one of the many shows or try your hand at one of the many casinos', who knows maybe lady luck will be smiling on you tonight for three nights at the Luxor Hotel or similar.

Day 28 - Friday Grand Canyon day tour

Explore the Grand Canyon National Park on this guided, full-day sightseeing adventure tour around the South Rim. Beginning in Las Vegas, travel to the Grand Canyon's South Rim and the National Geographic Visitor Center. See panoramic views from various lookout locations while learning about the history and geology of the canyon from your guide. The Grand Canyon in Arizona is a natural formation distinguished by layered bands of red rock, revealing millions of years of geological history in cross-section. Vast in scale, the canyon averages 10 miles across and a mile deep along its 277-mile length. Much of the area is a national park, with Colorado River white-water rapids and sweeping vistas.

Upgrade to include an IMAX movie and/or 2-hour tour of the canyon rim by Jeep or a scenic helicopter flight. Lunch and a Las Vegas hotel pickup and drop-off are included.

Day 29 - Saturday Free day Las Vegas

Today is a free day to explore Las Vegas at leisure. Las Vegas, in Nevada's Mojave Desert, is a resort city famed for its vibrant nightlife, centred around 24-hour casinos and other entertainment options. Its main street and focal point is the Strip, just over 4 miles long. This boulevard is home to themed hotels with

elaborate displays such as fountains synchronized to music as well as replicas of an Egyptian pyramid, the Venetian Grand Canal, and the Eiffel Tower.



Day 30 - Monday Fly Home to Australia

Please catch a taxi to Las Vegas airport for your flights home to Australia.

- **Vancouver** is located in the southwest corner of British Columbia in western Canada. It lies about three hours north of Seattle, WA, by car. If driving to Vancouver from the United States, allow for extra time at the border crossing, which can get busy, especially during holidays and long weekends
- **Inside Passage** follows Alaska cruise itineraries from Puget Sound in Washington, to the Alaskan Panhandle. As ships sail through, they give plenty of opportunity to see various the wildlife and landscapes that Alaska has to offer. Travelers can admire the ever-changing scenery that constantly transitions between beautiful coastal towns, towering forest walls, and massive glaciers that stretch up over narrow passageways. Be sure to watch for Bald Eagles, and search the water for signs of sea lions, porpoises, and whales as you cruise along.
- Secluded in the **Tongass National Forest, Tracy Arm** boasts some of the most spectacular views in North America. At the head of the fjord, you will observe dramatic views of the twin Sawyer Glaciers, which are surrounded by towering mountains that rise over 7,000 feet over the blue water. You will also see waterfalls and tidewater glaciers along the way and you may even catch a glimpse of the wildlife that calls this area home: the great bald eagle, seals relaxing on the icebergs and if you are lucky, a bear or mountain goat.
- Alaska's capital city of **Juneau** is a dramatic sight with a backdrop of lush green mountains. Visitors here can drive, float, paddle or take a helicopter to the monumental Mendenhall Glacier.

Other popular excursions include cruising along the straits and sounds of the Tongass National Forest, prospecting for gold at the original site of gold discovery or visiting the Alaska State Museum and the Alaska Brewing Company.

- **Skagway** - the northernmost point of the Inside Passage, the town reflects its mining past in the false-front buildings and gold rush relics. Tourists can experience the majesty of White Pass summit and the Yukon Territory aboard the railway, paddle to Glacier Bay and Chilkoot Bald Eagle Preserve, get a close-up view of the natural beauty on a wilderness safari, soar over glaciers on a helicopter tour or, for those who catch the fever, pan for gold.
- **Glacier Bay** - icy wilderness of this spectacular national park and preserve displays massive glaciers that stretch from the ice-draped St. Elias and Fairweather mountain ranges to the ends of majestic fjords. The park is also home to an amazing world of marine life, including humpback whales, sea otters, porpoises and harbor seals.
- **Ketchikan** - a traveller's first view of this Inside Passage port town may be of a boat-filled harbor enveloped in snow-capped mountains. The rustic city of Ketchikan has been called the totem pole capital of the world. Tours show off the city's streets,

restored from the pioneer days; the harbor's salmon canneries; and the world's oldest collection of totem poles at the Totem Heritage Center. Sport fishing, kayaking, hiking, bear watching and Misty Fjords seaplane excursions are also popular.
