DAY 1: Depart Australia

DAY 2: Rome



Welcome to Rome, and one of our most popular Italy tours! The first day of the tour is an arrivals day, please catch a taxi to your hotel. Then meet up with your tour guide at our accommodation in the afternoon and prepare for the tour of a lifetime! If you arrive early, head into the city and see some of the sites that make Rome famous the world over. An ancient city that has seen the rise and fall of entire empires, there is no shortage of historical real estate to feast your eyes on. Not to mention designer shopping and brilliant food. Tonight, you'll meet the rest of the tour group at our included welcome dinner.

### DAY 3: Rome



Today we'll take a guided walking tour of the city, stopping off at the landmarks that have made Rome a perennial favourite with travellers all over the world. See ancient Roman architecture, medieval buildings, Renaissance artworks and more remnants of Rome's illustrious past as capital of this incredible country – and of the Roman Empire at large. Be sure to see sightseeing highlights like the Spanish Steps, Trevi Fountain, the Roman Forum, the Pantheon and the countless other attractions that make Rome famous the world over. Later, you'll have the option of taking a guided walking tour of the Vatican City. Marvel at glittering artworks, vast marble halls and opulent architecture – all part and parcel of the Vatican's status as the seat of papal power. Eating and drinking well is also an important part of Roman life, and as they say, 'When in Rome, do as the Romans do.' Try excellent Italian cuisine, and be sure to grab a famous Roman gelato while you're sight-seeing!

### DAY 4: Rome - Orvieto - Venice



Leaving the capital behind, we'll drive through the region of Umbria. Known as the 'fruit bowl of Italy', it is famous for its produce, food and beautiful mountainous landscapes. Prepare for one of the most

spectacular sights in Europe as we approach Orvieto, a city perched dramatically atop sheer vertical volcanic rock. We'll take the funicular up to the historic centre, where you'll have some free time to explore and see the sights, including the exquisite facade of the Cathedral of Orvieto, the papal residence and the Alborno fortress, before we travel on to Venice. We'll get a classic Venetian view from the famous Rialto Bridge on our orientation walking tour. While in Venice you also have the opportunity to board a gondola and see Venice the traditional way, try classic Venetian cuisine, visit the famous museums and art galleries and simply get the full Venetian experience!

#### DAY 5: Venice - Free day



Take the time to explore today on your free day in Venice. Marvel at this incredible city, which features more artistic masterpieces per square kilometre than any other place on earth! Speak with your Expat Explore tour leader for suggestions for your free day in Venice. You also have the option of joining our evening excursion to Verona, where you can see Juliet's balcony – where Juliet is said to have been wooed by Romeo in Shakespeare's most famous play - and see the ancient amphitheatre built by the Romans.



## DAY 6: Lake Garda - Florence - Tuscany

Enjoy the option of a free day today in beautiful Tuscany, where options include further time in the city of Florence or exploring the spa town of Montecatini. You also have the option of joining an optional excursion to Pisa and Cinque Terre! A highlight of any tour to Italy, you'll be able to snap photos of the legendary Leaning Tower of Pisa and explore the grounds. We will then continue on to the stunning coastal town of La Spezia, the gateway to the Cinque Terre. Cinque Terre literally means

'Five Lands' and consists of five coastal cliff-side towns linked by rail and by footpaths. On this excursion return transport via Pisa is included in your tour package, and you have the option of purchasing a pass to enter Cinque Terre.

**DAY 8: San Gimignano - Siena - Rome**



This morning we make our way through one of the world's most picturesque countryside landscapes, admiring Tuscan farmhouses, vineyards and olive groves as we drive by. Our first stop of the day will be in San Gimignano, a small walled hill town. Known as the 'Town of Fine Towers', it offers beautiful Romanesque and Gothic architecture and 12 well-preserved tower houses. We'll then make the short drive to Siena, a UNESCO World Heritage Site famous for the 'Palio' horse race held twice a year in the main piazza, or public square. We'll enjoy a wine tasting accompanied with antipasto, before we head back to Rome and round the off the day with a farewell dinner together on our last night of the tour.

**DAY 9: Rome to Venice by Train to board cruise**

Your Italy coach tour concludes today as you board your train from Rome to Venice. Upon arrival catch a taxi to the cruise port to check in on MSC Opera Greece & Italy Cruise.

## Life aboard MSC Opera

Until mid-April 2020 MSC Opera sails around the Western Mediterranean, with 4- and 5-night cruises visiting Barcelona, Marseilles and Genoa. From late April to November 2020 MSC Opera returns to the Adriatic Sea and the most popular region of the Mediterranean. Embark at Venice or Bari (on the heel of Italy) to visit the Greek islands of Mykonos, Santorini and Corfu, and Kotor in Montenegro, with just one sea day. The Line offers good affordable cruise vacations the Italian Way, filled with fun activities and having a wide appeal. There are lots of children during school holidays. (It was on the morning of 2 June 2019 MSC Opera's engines apparently failed as she was docking in the Giudecca Canal, Venice. Opera rammed the river ship River Countess, which was displaced from her berth, avoiding a major catastrophe.)

MSC Opera has been in service since 2004. In July 2015 she returned from a refit with more balcony cabins, public areas, restaurants, and kids' areas. Extended by 24 m, at 65,000 GT, with 194 cabins added,

she now carries 2142 passengers. Her Italian décor avoids the neon glitter of some cruise lines, and accentuates marble, wood, brass, and soft furnishings. Guests are young adult couples, singles, and families with children of all ages with their associated noise (joie de vivre, or some may say ambiance). The ship appeals to mainly Europeans with multiple languages used onboard. The ship has few concessions for the physically challenged. During the northern Summer most passengers are from the Continent, but on the cruise you will also meet guests from the U.K., USA, and Australia. Europeans tend to smoke more, even in the no-smoking areas. Kids under 18 cruise free on some itineraries sharing a cabin with 2 adults.

### **Accommodation**

Two-thirds of the cabins have an outside view, and of these just one-quarter have a private balcony. Interior and Ocean View cabins are small at 12.9 sq.m. All cabins have interactive TV, AC, telephone, hairdryer, mini-bar/fridge, safe, wardrobe, bathroom with shower, and cotton towels. Two single beds can be converted to a double bed. Outside cabins have a large rectangular viewing window. The 132 suites with private balcony come with a large double bed, a sitting area with sofa, a substantial walk-in wardrobe, bathrobes, a well-stocked mini-bar, and an expanded bathroom with tub. The suites are well laid out and nicely furnished.

Many 'Ocean View' cabins on deck 7 have obstructed views, so be alert to this. For all cabins continental breakfast is complimentary from 7.30 to 10 am, while room service snacks can be bought at other times, but there is a per-item charge for other orders. For suites, a basket of fruit is provided at embarkation, and replenished daily. There are five cabins for the disabled, and no single cabins.

### **Food and Dining**

The principal dining room is La Caravella Restaurant, with open seating for breakfast and lunch, and two seatings for dinner. Instead of paying for cold water in dining rooms, fill your own bottle in your cabin, chill it in the mini-bar, and bring it with you at meal times. The smaller L'Approdo Restaurant shares the same menu. Dining is notable for its quantity rather than its quality, though the food is a highlight for many passengers. The alternative specialty restaurant is Kaito, an authentic Japanese venue with an extensive, outstanding menu. The quality is high, and it is really worth having at least one meal here. Le Vele Cafeteria is a casual, self-serve, 24-hour buffet. There is also a grill and pizzeria. A number of other cafés are located around the ship. MSC

Cruises provide better-quality ingredients, mostly from Europe, featuring Italian cuisine and regional wines, and daily fresh pizza dough and sauces.

There's no tea or coffee for lunch and dinner in the dining rooms, only in the buffet. You may have to ask for milk. For coffee and pastries head for The Coffee Corner. There are eight themed bars that include La Cabala Lounge, a piano lounge, and Sotto Vento Pub. Dining at breakfast and lunch in La Caravella may have you seated with others of a different language, given the continental background of the passengers.

### **Entertainment**

The two-deck Theatre dell Opera presents productions shows, cabaret, plays and other theatrical presentations. Some productions may be short, just 30 minutes. Entertainment includes the Opera Lounge for social dancing, the Byblos Discotheque, an extensive Internet café; and the Monte Carlo Casino. The ship has a number of bands and small ensembles to provide music for dancing and background. To get away from the constant activity and noise, retire to Library/Card Room.

The Health Centre is operated by Blue Ocean, and treatments include acupuncture. Facilities include steam room, sauna and beauty parlour. Fitness amenities include a gym, climbing wall, jogging area, two adult pools, two whirlpools and mini golf. Children have three play areas and their favourite, an ice-cream parlour. A "baby-parking" service is helpful when parents want to go on shore excursions. Teens have their own area on the top deck. A few occasional notes: Children sail free on certain itineraries, and in July/August there may be 400 or so. Heavy smokers are everywhere, and the staff are more focused on Italian passengers. Port calls may be short time-wise.



### **Life aboard MSC Musica**

Until March 2020 MSC Musica sails the Atlantic coast of South America. There cruises cruise mostly between Rio de Janeiro and Buenos Aires. So, brush up on your Portuguese and Spanish. Also, consider a low cost transatlantic cruise either way and see two continents. From April through October 2020 MSC Musica runs 7-night cruises round the beautiful Adriatic Sea between Venice and Athens. (Just note that port calls can be on the short side time-wise.) Boarding at Venice or the Italian port of Brindisi, this is arguably the most popular of all Mediterranean itineraries. In late October 2020 there's an interesting 26-night transition from Venice to South Africa. Join tours to Petra the hidden city, historical sites in Israel and Lebanon, Suez Canal transit, and overnight in the Seychelles. During the first quarter of 2021 short cruises leave Durban for the holiday regions of Mozambique. The Line offers good affordable cruise vacations the Italian Way, filled with fun activities and having a wide appeal.

Launched in 2006, MSC Musica at 92,409 GT carries 2,550 passengers. She is one of MSC Cruise Line's "Musica" family of ships. The interior décor of wood and marble, soft furnishings and colour reflects high Italian quality. English-speaking Italians have aimed this ship at English-speakers – but expect many German-speakers and others. The vessel is roomy, with plenty of lounges and bars, and has excellent alternative restaurants offering Italian and Japanese fare. Hear music day and night. Your fellow guests will be an eclectic mix from Europe and North America. MSC Cruises are family orientated, and children are very much catered for, filling the ship in school holidays. Children sail free on certain itineraries, sharing a cabin with two adults. Mini Club (ages three to ten), organises arts and crafts activities, dancing, painting courses,

treasure hunts and a mini-Olympics and crafts activities, dancing, painting courses, treasure hunts and a mini-Olympics.

### **Accommodation**

Four out of five cabins have an outside view, and of these four out of five have a balcony. Cabins are stylish. For all cabins continental breakfast is complimentary from 7.30 to 10 am, while room service snacks can be bought at other times. In suites a basket of fruit is provided at embarkation, and replenished daily. Cabins come with a mini-bar, personal safe, ample closet, shower-only tub, terrycloth robes, flat-screen TV, and excellent 24-hour room service. Suites have in addition fresh flowers, daily tray of canapés, hangers, upgraded toiletries, bathroom with tub, and king-size bed (or two singles).

Ninety-eight 'Ocean View' cabins on deck 8 have obstructed views, so be alert to this. Suites also have a large lounge area and walk-in closet, vanity desk with hair dryer. Some very popular staterooms are at the aft of the ship with views of the wake from balcony cabins. There are 18 suites with a private balcony, no single cabins, and 17 that are wheelchair-accessible.

### **Food and Dining**

The two main dining rooms, Le Maxim's and L'Oleandro, are located aft with large ocean-view windows. There are two seatings for dinners. Instead of paying for cold water in dining rooms, fill your own bottle in your cabin, chill it in the mini-bar, and bring it with you at meal times. Guests in suites and deluxe grades are assigned seats in a quieter section of Le Maxim's. Dishes range from traditional and tasty Mediterranean fare, to the most refined international recipes. There is the "Always Available" menu, which includes spaghetti and grilled chicken, beefsteak or salmon. Alternatively, reservations-only Il Giardino is an à la carte extra-charge venue that serves "refined Italian food." Kaito is a Japanese sushi bar with table seating.

There's no tea or coffee for lunch and dinner in the dining rooms, only in the buffet. You may have to ask for milk. For a quick breakfast or lunch choose the Gli Archi buffet restaurant, offering the utmost quality and variety in Italian and international cuisine, or the pool-deck eatery. Coffee/tea and pastries are available at several bars near the atrium. Each of the 16 bars is inspired by a different theme and offers an excellent wine and food selection. Restaurants at breakfast and lunch may have you seated with others of a different language, given the continental background of the passengers.

## **Entertainment**

The state-of-the-art 1240 seat two-deck Teatro La Scala is the principal showlounge. Some productions may be short, just 30 minutes. The Il Tucano Lounge is the main centre for social dancing and functions such as cooking demonstrations. Another dance floor is in the Crystal Lounge nightclub. The young and lively go to the loud and futuristic Q32 Disco. View big-screen movies on the large screen above the forward pool. The Sanremo Casino boasts over 600 square metres of casino gaming. Play Virtual Games in the video games room. Daytime activities include a broad range of traditional competitions, quizzes and auctions, as well as Italian lessons, cooking demonstrations and exercise classes. As for shore excursions, there is a wide range of options, but the queues can be long.

Fitness programs include a small gym with classes, and courts that include a shortened tennis court, jogging area, shuffleboard, mini-golf, a golf simulator, and table tennis. The Balinese-themed spa facility comes with all the expected health treatments – colourful, and boasting two Turkish baths, three hot tubs and two saunas, all private and with great views. The Spas are operated by Steiner Leisure, and treatments include acupuncture. Children are well provided for, from three years to late teens. A “baby-parking” service is helpful when parents want to go on shore excursions.
